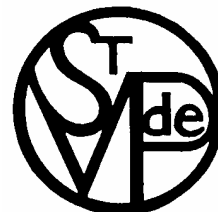
The K.C. Fish Fry on Fridays during Lent, also offer "take out" meals. They can be picked up at the tent in the back parking lot.
