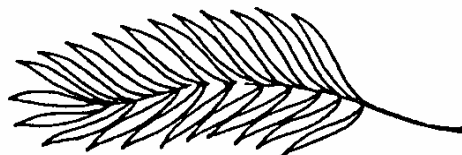

Lent has been a preparation not just for Easter Sunday, but for the Triduum, which means "Three Days".

We celebrate the Triduum, the Three Days, of the Paschal Mystery of Our Lord, from Holy Thursday evening through Easter Sunday evening. These feasts are at the heart of the Christian experience. It is the great story, embracing our individual stories, that draws us out to where we can never return. It is the journey of awe during which we ritually enact what we dare not ponder. These awesome rituals take us through the mystery of death into the silent testimony of an empty tomb and the invitation to belief. Through the yearly pilgrimage of these liturgies we discover once more who we are and Whose we are. We learn the meaning of life, professed once in Baptism, inaugurated anew in Easter mysteries. We discover ourselves to be the earthly body of the Lord broken again so that others might live. We journey through cross and tomb to the promised life beyond every expectation or understanding. This is the heart of the Christian faith and heartbeat of our lives as followers of Jesus Christ.

The Triduum consists of one liturgy, spread over three days. Note that there is no dismissal on Holy Thursday, no greeting or dismissal on Good Friday, and no greeting at the Easter Vigil. These celebrations, taken as a group, are the high point of the Church's liturgical year. To celebrate Easter in its fullness, we should celebrate all three days of the Triduum.

We invite all to join with us in celebrating the ultimate triumph of Christ over sin and death.

Policy about Annulment Petitions

The Tribunal Office of the Diocese of Galveston-Houston has revised its formal petition form for annulments. Beginning September 1, 2003, the Tribunal Office will **only** accept the newly revised petition form to apply for an annulment. If you have already begun to prepare to petition the Tribunal for an annulment, you **MUST** complete and submit the petition form that you are using by August 31, 2003. After that date, only the newly revised form will be accepted. Please consult your parish priest or deacon for clarification.
